## THIS DAY IN UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST HISTORY

---

**Jan 14, 1875** – Albert Schweitzer was born. He became a medical missionary in Africa after earning doctorates not only in medicine but also in theology, philosophy, and music. An eminent author of books on Bach, Jesus, civilization, and ethics, he was a member of the Unitarian Church of Capetown, South Africa.

**Jan. 15, 1893** – Fanny Kemble, famous English actress turned American abolitionist, died. She was heavily influenced by Unitarians William Ellery Channing and Lydia Maria Child. After marrying a Philadelphia gentleman who owned plantations and slaves in Georgia, she was appalled at slavery, divorced her husband, and joined the abolition movement, publishing her *Journal of a Residence on a Georgia Plantation*.

**Jan. 16, 1876** – Edmund Hamilton Sears, Unitarian missionary, parish minister, and hymn writer who composed “It Came Upon the Midnight Clear,” died.

**Jan. 17, 1898** – Lady Frances Anna Maria Russell, who helped to organize the Unitarian church in Richmond, Surrey, England, died. Her grandson was philosopher Bertrand Russell.
